#### Purpose

- Analysis of the 2025 state and federal legislative climate.
- Share legislative platform development process and next steps.
- Review list of proposed legislative platform items.
- Discussion and take input for items to refine, add, remove or reprioritize.



#### **State Legislative Outlook**

- Ramsey County Delegation positioned well.
- Election season almost everywhere.
  - House Majority need 68.
  - Senate Majority need 34.
- November Forecast-Revenue projects up \$189 million.
- Governor's Budget-January 28, 2025.
- Democrats will want a bonding bill.
- State Office Building is closed; House offices in the Centennial Building.

#### **Federal Legislative Outlook**

- MN's delegation remains well positioned to support Ramsey County.
- Emergency needs could mean Congress is called back before November.
- Congress passed a Continuing Resolution (CR) to maintain until 12/20/24.
- Post-election political landscape will influence direction of lame-duck session.
- Lame-duck session.
  - Appropriations bills will resume.
  - FY 2024 & FY 2025 Ramsey County Community Project Funding (i.e., Earmarks or Congressionally Directed Spending).
  - Possible additional legislation: Defense Authorization, WIOA & Farm bill.

### Government Relations' Approach to Lobbying/Equipping the Organization

- Expanded team.
- Be present at the Legislature, with all internal/external stakeholders.
- Currently provide weekly newsletter update, Monday Morning Legislative Update group, testifying assistance.
- Working to provide more opportunities and learning for employees.
- Legislative Team meets regularly.

  - Legislative buy in and support; community input.
  - Leveraging federal Infrastructure Bill funding.
  - Similar for requests of other bonding request and process for congressionally directed spending.
