- Elections Staff

Work of our Community Partnerships

“It Takes a Village”

- Over 100 permanent, temporary, & intern staff
 - Averaged 55hr work weeks
 - 3,134 hours of overtime
 - Worked every weekend since 9/1/20
 - Does not include the ballot board staff
- 2500+ Election Judges
 - Since May, average age of new election judges is under 40
 - Used the entire Metro Conference Center

Record Setting Voter Participation

- 297,365 total voters
 - 22,585 more voters than 2016 Presidential Election
 - 88% of total reg. voters in 2020
 - 89% of total reg. voters in 2016
 - 83% of total reg. voters in 2012
 - 87% of total reg. voters in 2008

- Record number of Registered Voters in Ramsey County in 2020
 - 334,734 in Nov. 2020
 - 309,140 in Nov. 2018
 - 305,623 in Nov. 2016



Record Setting Voter Registration

St. Paul 1-9 (Thomas-Dale Neighborhood)

- 2020: 1,828 total voters (74% of Reg. Voters)
- 2016: 1,657 total voters (72% of Reg. Voters)
- Increase of 181 Reg. Voters since 2016

St. Paul 5-4 (Rice St-North End Neighborhood)

- 2020: 3,192 total voters (81% of Reg. Voters)
- 2016: 2,797 total voters (82% of Reg. Voters)
- Increase of 552 Reg. Voters since 2016

St. Paul 6-1 (Payne-Phalen Neighborhood)

- 2020: 1,350 total voters (87% of Reg. Voters)
- 2016: 1,164 total voters (83% of Reg. Voters)
- Increase of 143 Reg. Voters since 2016

Dramatic Increase in Absentee Voting

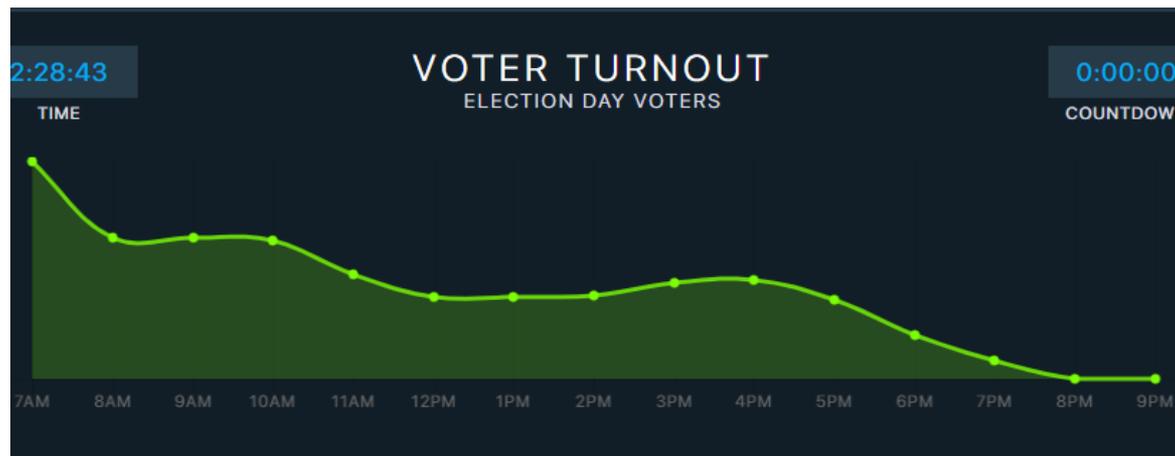
- Dramatic increase in absentee voting
 - 194,433 absentee ballots (65% of all voters)
 - 145,540 by mail
 - 48,893 in-person
 - 206% increase in absentee voting from 2016
 - 63,384 AB voters in 2016 Presidential Election
- Three in-person absentee voting locations
- Seven early voting locations
- Ten ballot return locations
 - 26% of all mail ballots were returned in-person
 - Average of 3,888 in-person voters per day the final week of voting
- Online wait-time app
- Ballot Board staffed with over 100 persons



Roseville Library

Quiet, Smooth Election Day

- Very quiet, smooth day. Few reports of any concern
 - 102,714 Election Day voters
- Turnout trends:
 - Very busy at 7am, 14k check-ins
 - Less than 1k check-ins at 7pm
 - Dramatic slow down as day went on. Opposite of August Primary trends



Providing a Transparent Election

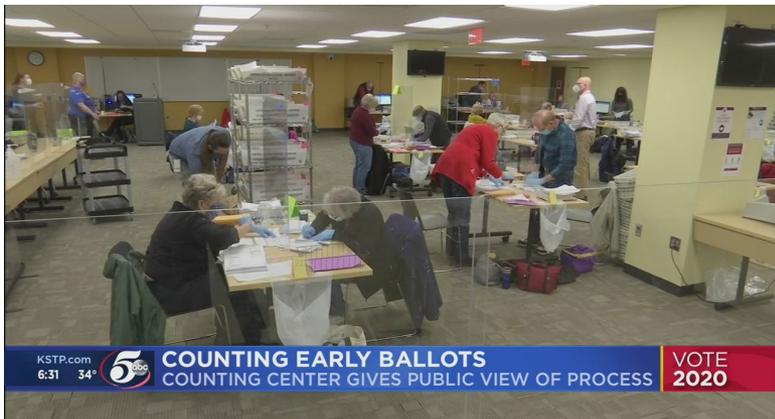
- All results reported on Election Night
 - Provides confidence in our vote totals, what you see on election night is 99% final.
 - Some Counties reported partial absentee results on election night and finished on 11/4 & 11/5.
 - Impacts on close races as seen across Minnesota.
- Post-election counting per Consent Decree
 - Counting of all 11/3 postmarked mail-ballots received 11/4 thru 11/10.
 - 193 ballots received in this time period
 - 69 were UOCAVA ballots



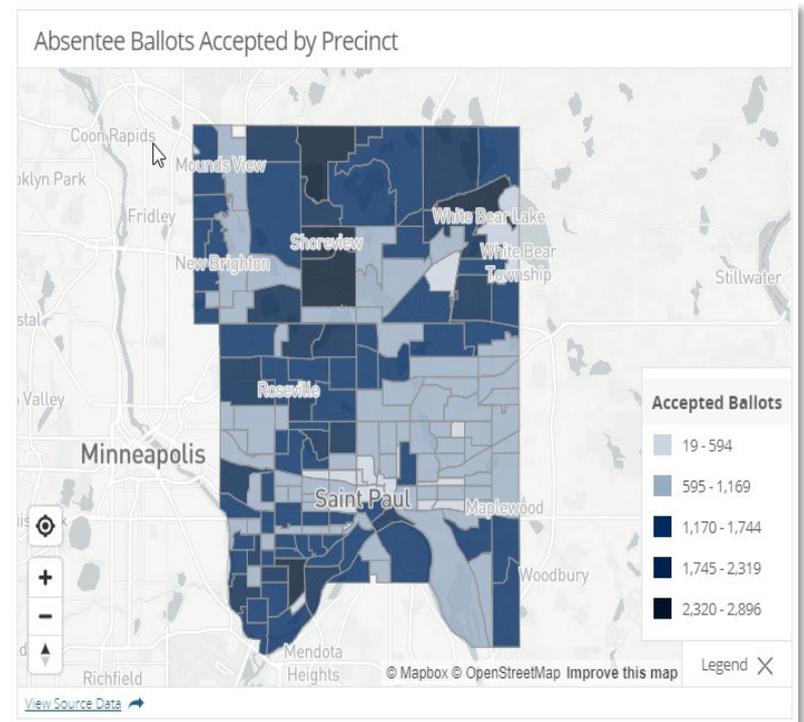
