# **Priority Populations**

Priority 1: Individuals living in congregate shelters

- Physical distancing at all shelters
- Protective housing for single adults and families
- Quarantine and isolation for single adults

### Priority 2: Unsheltered persons living outside

 Continue to partner with local shelters and organizations, including RADIAS Health, People Inc., City of Saint Paul, shelter providers, law enforcement, and various Ramsey County departments to support and advocate for individuals in unsheltered settings





Higher Ground	356	178
Union Gospel Mission	177	177 (expanded into non-shelter rooms)
Safe Space	64	64 (expanded into unused space)

Shelter	Added Capacity
Women's Hotel-Shelter	80
Elders Hotel-Shelter	115
Hotel-Shelter Alternative	114
COVID-19 Respite	72



# Safe and Stable Shelter Operations

### 24/7 On-site Staffing

- Staff reflect the residents and have diverse experiences
- Build relationships with residents
- CPR and Narcan trained

### **Pathways to Housing Stability**

- On-site benefit and housing navigation
- Removing barriers for housing readiness

### **Wraparound Services**

- 3 meals per day provided
- On-site mental health services
- Transportation services
- Health care and nursing

### **Trauma-informed Security**

- Rooted in de-escalation
- Aware of mental health crises
- 24/7 presence
- Inside and outside facility



# **Bethesda Hospital**

- Operational mid-December through April 2022
- Initial approach
  - 2 floors dedicated to COVID-19 respite care for up to 68 people
  - 2 floors dedicated to shelter for 100 individuals (men) which offers 24/7 services through referrals from community outreach teams and other shelters
- Seeking community partners to provide shelter services, mental health and chemical dependency services for shelter residents.





# **Luther Seminary**

- Operational mid-December through April 2021
- Former Dormitory building on Luther Seminary campus in Saint Anthony Park Neighborhood
- Provides capacity for up to 50 women and couples through referrals from community outreach teams and shelters
- Additional hotel space for single adults are being solidified for 2021





# **Investments and Expanded Capacity in Family Shelters**

### **July 2020**

Funded move of Project
Home rotating shelter from
the church to Hotel 340
and increased from 11
families to 22 families

### November 2020

Started a service contract with Voices of East African Women for additional family shelter space

### December 2020

Worked with Interfaith Action to find a permanent Project Home location with the Sister's of St. Joseph



# **Day Shelter Expansion**

- Safe Space Daytime hours are now from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- Saint Paul Opportunity Center Nighttime hours extended to 10 p.m.
- Finalizing a service contract and agreement with Listening House to operate in the city-owned Freedom House on Grand and West Seventh in Saint Paul

Ramsey County referral staff screens for appropriate capacity and placement location

### 3. TRANSPORTATION

Ramsey county referral staff or referral source arranges transportation to the appropriate shelter

Single adult men

#### **Luther Seminary**

Women and couples - couples may share rooms; LGTBQ+ couples are welcomed

#### 4. HOTEL PROGRAMS

Ramsey County referral staff arranges appropriate hotel placement of eligible resident(s) who have stayed for at least seven (7) successful days at Mary Hall, Luther Seminary, or other partnering shelter locations

# Staffing and Spending Since March 16, 2020

140

 Approximate staff hired for Homelessness Operations, including staff who were redeployed

 Additional anticipated number of staff needed to be hired in the next few months to cover projected capacity needs

An estimated over \$7,000,000 of CARES spending on homelessness through November 2020

Housing Department to be established in mid-February 2021 within the Economic Growth and Community Investment (EGCI) Service Team



# Outreach Efforts, Shelter Capacity, and Programming



\$500,000 in Rapid Rehousing Program from the Emergency Solutions Grant

\$250,000 for outreach expansion to connect unsheltered families from the Emergency Solutions Grant



75 slots for long-term housing providers through Housing Support

165 slots for assisted living providers through the state's Housing Support Program
